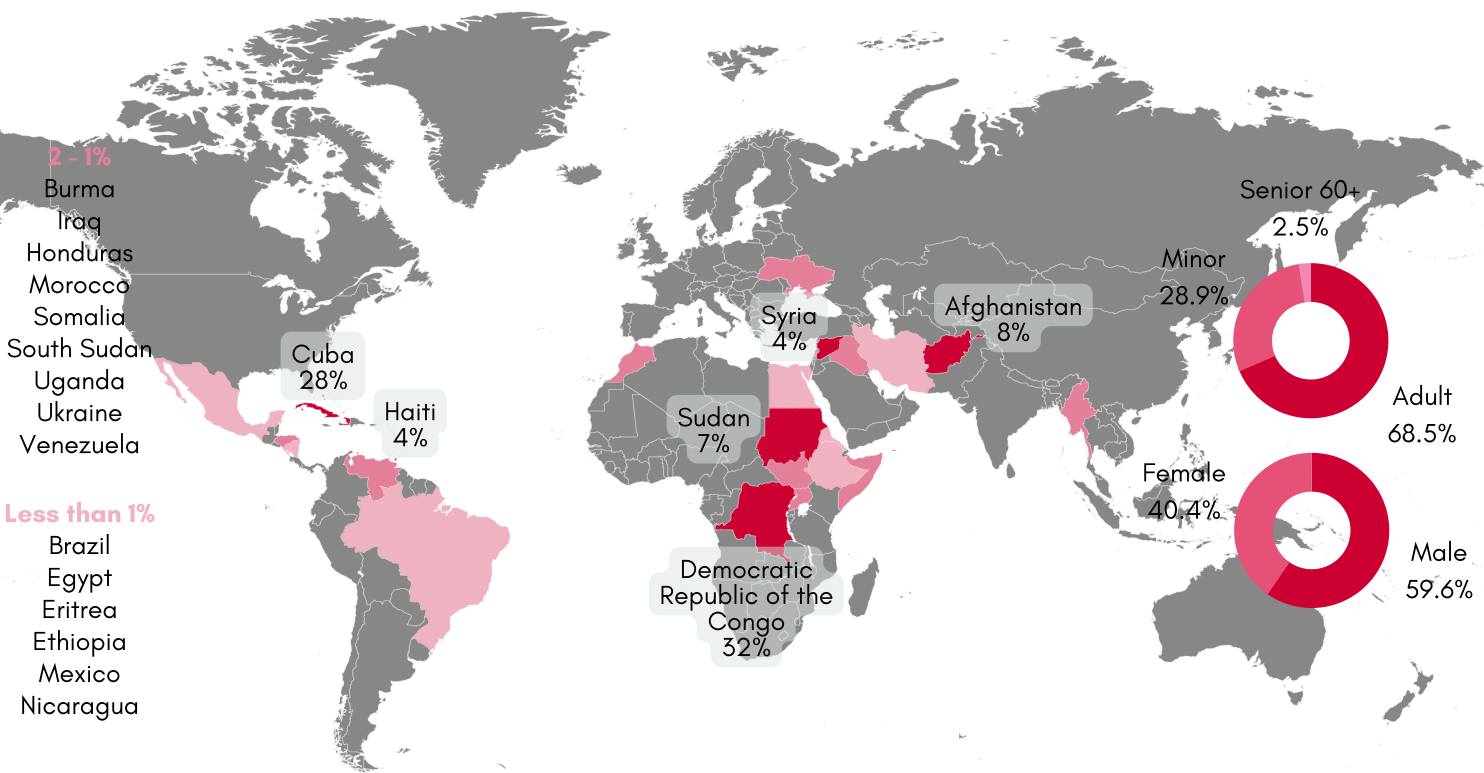

Who we serve



Refugees 59%

Those who have fled their country and are unwilling or unable to return due to fear of persecution.

Cuban/Haitian Entrants 32%

Cuban or Haitian nationals who are legally in the United States but have not yet received a permanent status.

SIVs 6%

Iraqi or Afghan nationals who were employed by the U.S. military or government agency overseas.

Asylees 3%

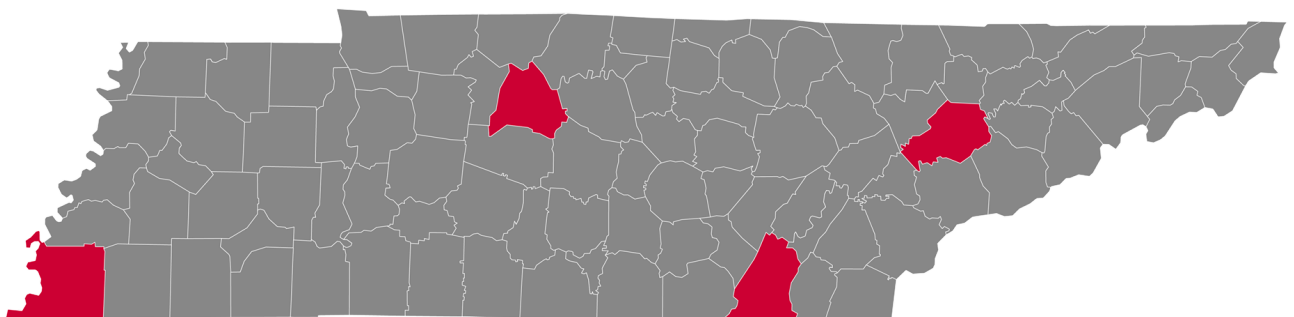
Those who, like refugees, fled their country for fear of persecution, but travel to the United States with their own resources.

Victims of Trafficking <1%

Those who have been forced to provide labor, services, or sex by force, fraud, or coercion.

Our Impact

Our mission is to foster **growth**, **integration**, and **self-sufficiency** by providing financial, technical, and professional support to refugees and the agencies that serve them in the State of Tennessee.

127 clients started a new job, and

492 clients participated in employment services to promote early self-sufficiency



28 refugee youth set academic and career goals in the new Youth Mentoring Program, and

217 students received School Impact services that helped them adapt to their new schools

481 clients attended English Language Instruction classes



37 clients engaged in elders programming that connects seniors to community aging programs and naturalization resources

385 clients received a medical screening



Clients are eligible for most integration services for up to 5 years after arrival. Our impact goes beyond the year's arrivals to those who are in the early years of making Tennessee their home.
